**An invitation to comment on the proposed addition of species to the  
*Species at Risk Act***

Greetings,

Environment Canada is currently seeking comments from the public on the proposed addition of species to the Federal Government's *Species at Risk Act* (SARA). In an attempt to arrive at the best possible decision, the Government of Canada welcomes your observations and comments on the listing of species under the SARA.

Every year, the status of many species in Canada is assessed by the Committee on the Status of Endangered Wildlife in Canada (COSEWIC), a scientific body that provides advice on species at risk independently of government influence. COSEWIC then provides its assessment of species to Environment Canada for consideration for listing under the SARA. The Minister of Environment then decides whether to provide legal protection for each species by adding it to Schedule 1 of the SARA, the official list of species at risk. The Minister accomplishes this task with the help of the public, through collecting and reviewing comments made during the consultation process. Your comments, questions or concerns are therefore welcomed as part of the consultation process, and we invite you to contact Environment Canada directly through our website and/or staff contacts, which are listed below. Your comments should be received by March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2010 in order to be considered by the Minister. The final decision whether or not to add these species to Schedule 1 is expected to be made in December 2010.

Once a species has been added to the *Species at Risk Act*, the federal government's intent is to ensure its protection and recovery, consistent with the Act. The primary goal is to improve the species' numbers, and remove or mitigate threats, such that the species is no longer at risk. Endangered and threatened species will be automatically protected on federally owned lands, and a process will be set in motion to plan for the recovery of these species throughout their range. As part of recovery planning, "critical habitat", which is the habitat needed for the species' survival and recovery, will be determined for each endangered and threatened listed species and appropriate protection measures will be established.

In Canada, 26 terrestrial species have recently been assessed by COSEWIC. Fourteen (14) of these species are found in BC. Of these species, eight (8) are proposed for listing and one (1) is proposed for a status change. The remaining five (5) species' status was reassessed and confirmed. A list of the BC species and their general locations is included in the table below.

COSEWIC assessments and status reports, and the Minister of the Environment's statement on how he intends to respond to the assessments, are available on the SARA Public Registry, listed below. The SARA Public Registry is a website designed to provide

both information to the public about the *Species at Risk Act*, and a means for communication and consultations. ***Please note that to inform the Minister's listing decision, we request your comments by March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2010.*** Following that there will also be an opportunity to provide comments during the 30-day public consultation period associated with pre-publication in Canada Gazette Part I. This is expected to occur in June 2010. All BC species, with the exception of the Horned Grebe (Western population), follow normal consultation timelines. Due to extended timelines for the Horned Grebe (Western population), comments for this species are requested by March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011. Please also be assured that all comments received by the submission deadline will be considered before the Federal Government makes a final decision on whether or not to list each of these species.

I encourage you to take this opportunity to review the recommended species, seek information from our staff, and offer your input on potential impacts related to the listing or recovery of these species. We very much appreciate your participation in this process. It is with your help that Environment Canada can arrive at the best possible solution for the protection of species at risk in Canada.
